

TOURIST SIGHTS

1

Jūrmala museum. The museum's collection includes many exhibits that tell the story of life in the resort from the late 19th century to the 20th century. The museum has several exhibition halls and a souvenir shop. Open from Wednesday to Sunday 10:00–17:00 (until 18:00 in summer). Free admission. **Tirgoņu iela 29**

Jomas iela – central pedestrian street. Since the 19th century, Jomas Street with its cafés, restaurants and shops has been a popular meeting, walking and relaxing place for visitors and residents of the resort city. Most of the buildings are architectural monuments.

"Star Cinema Jūrmala".

Horn's Garden. In 1870, the first tenant Albert Horn built a hotel, a restaurant, a cinema and an open-air concert garden where famous symphony orchestras performed. In 1970, the Jūrmala Cinema was built here, now the Jūrmala Culture Centre. Nowadays, the public garden hosts concerts, cultural and entertainment events. **Jomas iela 35**

Art Gallery of Jūrmala Culture Centre.
Open: Tuesday–Saturday 12:00–18:00.
Free admission. **Jomas iela 35.**

Art gallery "Inner Light". The art gallery features paintings with light-reflecting or fluorescent paints. Open every day 11:00–17:00.

Jūras iela. Almost all architectural styles characteristic of Jūrmala can be seen here, represented by 23 buildings - architectural monuments of national and local importance.

Sculpture "The Turtle". The bronze sculpture "Turtle" by sculptor Jānis Bārda is a popular photo place. **Tirgoņu iela 1**

The beach. Jūrmala's 24-km long sandy beach is an ideal place not only for summer relax but also for riding bicycles and walks. There is an **illuminated trail** along the beach from Majori to Dzintari.

Photo object "Jūrmala". Large size letters "Jūrmala" set up on the beach make a popular place for capturing moments in photographs.

Dzintari Concert Hall. The historical building was built in 1936, designed by architects Aleksandrs Birzenieks and Viktors Mellenbergs in the neo-eclecticism and national romanticism styles with Art Deco features. In 1960, an open-air summer concert hall, designed by architect Modris Ģelzis, was built. Concerts and festivals take place here throughout a year.

Dzintari forest park and viewing tower. The park includes playgrounds, roller-skating and pedestrian paths, a skatepark, streetball courts and cafés. The park has a 33-metre-high viewing tower.

In winter, the park is decorated with Christmas decorations. Open daily 9:00–22:00. Free admission. **Lazdonas iela**

Adventure parks "Jūrmalas Tarzāns" and Jūrmala Net Adventure Park. Routes of various difficulty levels in the trees. The net park is made up of various bouncy net areas and tunnels. Open from May to October daily 10:00–20:00.

Cottage of Rainis and Aspazija. Rainis and Aspazija lived in the summer cottage from 1927 until the poet's death in 1929. The museum complex comprises three buildings typical of Jūrmala's wooden architecture. Open from Tuesday to Saturday 10:00–17:00.

Square opposite railway station Majori. The sculpture "Lāčplēsis" by sculptor Leonīds Kristovskis, the fountain "Horizon" by sculptor Inta Berga and bronze seagulls on a bench by sculptor Kristaps Gulbis can be seen in the square. In spring and summer, the square is adorned with colourful flowering greenery. **Jomas iela 32.**

17

House of Aspazija. A wooden architectural and historical monument built in 1903. Latvian poet Aspazija spent the sunset years of her life here. The exhibition features authentic interior

and everyday objects from the early 20th century and modern holograms. Open from Tuesday to Saturday 10:00–17:00 (until 18:00 in summer). Free admission. **Zigfrīda Meierovica prospekts 18/20**

Sculpture "Aspazija in the dunes".

The sculpture made by Olga Šilova is dedicated to the outstanding Latvian poet and playwright Aspazija. **End of Aspazijas iela**

19

Art station "Dubulti". Contemporary art exhibition hall integrated in the still functioning Dubulti railway station. Open daily 9:00–18:00. Free admission. **Zigfrīda Meierovica prospekts 4**

20

Dubulti Evangelical Lutheran Church. Built in 1907–1909. Architect - Wilhelm Bockslaff. Art Nouveau building with features of national romanticism. The church is used for church services and organ concerts. **Baznīcas iela 13**

21

Wellness nature path. A 2 km long, well-equipped nature path in the coastal dune area. **Baznīcas iela, by the beach**
